The Oregonian newspaper has 42 employees, including part-time and full-time workers.

In the year 2018, 15 employees of the Oregonian did a “catch n’ kill” deal in which they accepted a financial bribe to publish or not publish a story about a personal bias crime. These 15 employees work together as a group on “catch n’ kill” deals, totaling 13 deals so far for the year 2018. The minimum amount of money any of these Oregonian employees have received in 2018 for a “catch n’ kill” deal is \$1,000 and the maximum any of them have received for a “catch n’ kill” deal is \$9,500.

Each of these 15 employees of the Oregonian who have participated in “catch n’ kill” deals committed one or more felonies as defined by Oregon Revised Statutes as a part of the deal.

Out of this group of 15 Oregonian employees doing “catch n’ kill” deals, 11 of them have committed felony conspiracy to commit rape in the first degree as defined by Oregon Revised Statutes at least 13 times in the year 2018, and 3 of them have committed felony conspiracy to commit any type of child sex abuse as defined by Oregon Revised Statutes at least twice in the year 2018.

Dear Owners of the Oregonian Newspaper,

I am extending my apologies to you for missing the window of opportunity to provide this information confidentially to you through snail mail, which was my preference. I have no desire to harm your business or the reputation of your business. Your newspaper business is not alone in being infiltrated by the rape gang and suffering abuses of trust by your employees. Due to the recent resignation of NY Attorney General Eric Schneiderman, who would have authorized and supported Senator Jeff Merkley being prosecuted for his sex crimes on children, as well as any person who committed sex crimes on children no matter their status, connections, or profession, the circumstances require that I make this information public as soon as possible. Thank you for your understanding.

As of today, May 16<sup>th</sup>, nine of the eleven female senior members of the New York Attorney General’s Office have committed felonies as defined by NY Penal Code in the year 2018.

During the year 2018, two female senior members of the NY Attorney General’s Office have committed felony rape in the first degree as defined by NY Penal Code 130.35, felony rape in the second degree as defined by NY Penal Code 130.30, and felony rape in the third degree as defined by NY Penal Code 130.25.

Three female senior members of the NY Attorney General’s Office have committed felony assault in the first degree as defined by NY Penal Code 120.10 a minimum of five times in 2018.
