Dear Arizona State Legislative Assembly,

I recently moved back to Tucson and I am registered to vote in Arizona.

I am requesting immediate emergency legislation to address the crimes of human trafficking people with disabilities in the state of Arizona. The Department of Economic Security's Division of Developmental Disabilities is lacking the necessary manpower to adequately perform their duties. There are over 62,000 people living with disabilities in Arizona who are under-served and in need of a rescue from being trafficked; about 32% are citizens of the United States.

In 2018:

- 43,000 people with disabilities aged 7-12 years old are being trafficked out of their homes in Arizona
- 15,000 people with disabilities aged 13-18 years old are being trafficked out of their homes in Arizona
- 1800 people with disabilities aged 19-60 years old are being trafficked out of their homes in Arizona
- 2500 people with disabilities aged 61-100 years old are being trafficked out of their homes in Arizona

I trust that you will see to it that the Department of Economic Security receives emergency aid at the level of attending to a natural disaster that has wrecked the safety and stability of a population of people, no matter how unnatural a disaster of violence human trafficking is.
