

## PSYCHIATRY IN THE UNITED STATES

In 2018, out of all the people licensed to practice psychiatry by a state medical board in the U.S.:

73% of them currently have one or more violent mental disorders as defined by the diagnostic criteria of the DSM-5

In 2018, out of the people licensed to practice psychiatry by a state medical board in the U.S.:

68% of them have Sexual Sadism Disorder

24% of them have Anti-Social Personality Disorder

9% of them have Pedophilic Disorder

6% of them have Schizophrenia

5% of them have the mental disorder of Psychopathy

In 2018, out of all the people licensed to practice psychiatry by any state medical board in the U.S. who currently have Anti-Social Personality Disorder:

- 73% have committed felony murder as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact in this lifetime
- 78% have committed felony assault as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 76% have committed felony rape as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- none of them have ever taken any prescription medications made to treat Anti-Social Personality Disorder in this lifetime

In 2018, out of all the people licensed to practice psychiatry by any state medical board in the U.S. who currently have the mental disorder of Psychopathy:

- 58% have committed felony murder as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact in this lifetime
- 100% have committed felony assault as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 100% have committed felony rape as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 83-84% of them are taking prescription medications advertised to treat the symptoms of psychopathy as prescribed

In 2018, out of all the people licensed to practice psychiatry by any state medical board in the U.S. who currently have Sexual Sadism Disorder:

- 100% have committed felony rape as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 100% have committed felony assault as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 77% have committed felony murder as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact in this lifetime
- none of them have ever taken any prescription medications made to treat Sexual Sadism Disorder in this lifetime
- 83-84% of them concurrently have Anti-Social Personality Disorder
- more than 75% of them concurrently have Pedophilic Disorder
- 18-19% of them have been without any paid employment in 2018
- 62% of them are seeing clients in private practice
- 6-7% of them have full-time employment at a college or university
- 17-18% of them have full-time employment at a psychiatric institution

In 2018, out of all the people licensed to practice psychiatry by any state medical board in the U.S. who currently have Pedophilic Disorder:

- 100% have committed felony child sex abuse as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 100% have committed felony assault as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. with direct contact within the last three years
- 95% of them concurrently have Sexual Sadism Disorder
- 56% of them concurrently have Anti-Social Personality Disorder
- none of them have ever taken any prescription medications made to treat Pedophilic Disorder in this lifetime

In 2018, out of all the people licensed to practice psychiatry by any state medical board in the U.S. who currently have Schizophrenia:

- 0% have committed felony assault as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. in this lifetime
- 0% have committed felony rape as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. in this lifetime
- 0% have committed felony murder as defined by any of the state laws of the U.S. in this lifetime
- none of them have been involuntarily committed into a psychiatric institution in this lifetime
- none of them have ever taken any prescription medications made to treat Schizophrenia
- all of them are on medical leave and have been without any paid employment in 2018

- 56-57% of them have had Schizophrenia for the last four years
- 42-43% of them developed Schizophrenia for the first time within the last year
- none of them have committed felony child sex abuse as defined by any of state laws of the U.S. in this lifetime
