

2018 – 2019 CENSUS ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN ARIZONA

Of the population of people who survived human trafficking while permanent residents of Arizona in 2018:

- more than 12% were male heterosexuals over the age of 35 years old
- more than 7% had or were a head of household with a gross yearly income* over \$100,000 in 2018
- more than 76% had or were a head of household with a gross yearly income* over \$50,000 in 2018
- more than 7% had or were a head of household with a gross yearly income* of \$5k-20k in 2018
- more than 54% were female
- more than 43% were male
- more than 2% identified as transgender
- more than 33% were over 35 years old
- more than 52% were over 18 years old
- more than 47% were under 18 years old
- more than 32% were under 10 years old
- over 43% were immigrants within the last five years of when they were very first trafficked
- over 53% were U.S. citizens in 2018
- over 32% do not currently have pedophilia
- over 67% have perpetrated human trafficking in 2019
- over 67% currently have pedophilia
- over 42% have perpetrated human trafficking on any of their biological children in 2019
- over 54% have perpetrated human trafficking on their spouse or domestic partner in 2019
- over 42% have perpetrated human trafficking on anyone's adopted child or foster child in 2019
